Description: This scholarship will be awarded to an outstanding nursing student who goes above their scholarly commitment and is heavily involved in community service.

Qualifications

1. Candidate must be currently enrolled in an entry level registered nurse (RN) program in the state of Maryland.
2. Candidate must have a minimum 3.0 GPA.
3. Candidate must be a current member of NSNA.
4. Candidate must be actively engaged in Community Service Projects.

All of the following must accompany your application at the time of submission. All transcripts and letters of recommendation must be submitted in a sealed envelope:

1. Official transcript(s) from an accredited School of Nursing in the state of Maryland.
2. Typed responses to two (2) essay questions.
3. Two (2) letters of recommendation (at least one from applicant's school of nursing)
4. Copy of NSNA card.
5. Copy of professional resume noting your education, organization memberships, leadership positions, work experience, and community/volunteer experience.
6. Additional items to accompany the application in support of the candidates' eligibility and desirability may be included. Examples are:
 - a. Letters of recommendation from community service supervisors for each activity you wish to be considered as part of this award. (Letters should include amount of hours, what type of services were performed, specific dates for event involvement and the results of that event with accurate numerical measurements and finally an overall impression of the applicant) (Not optional)
 - b. Involvement in the school chapter of NSNA, i.e., letters, news clippings, awards, certificates, etc.
